Point in Time Count January 31, 2018

Various non-profits and state agencies providing services to homeless persons are gearing up for the twelfth official statewide Point In Time count of homeless community members.

The Vermont Coalition to End Homelessness (Balance of State Continuum of Care) and the Chittenden County Homeless Alliance (Chittenden Continuum of Care) are again joining efforts for the twelfth statewide Point in Time Count on January 31, 2018. The Continuum are comprised of local homeless, housing & human service organizations that strive to make homelessness in our communities rare and brief. These efforts will be supported by the Agency of Human Services and the Vermont State Housing Authority.

The twelfth coordinated Point in Time Count will collect data to be used by the Balance of State, Chittenden County, and local continuums in their funding applications to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, as well as to provide a statewide baseline for measuring the success of housing and supportive services used to reduce the number of people who are homeless in Vermont.

Vermont's last Point in Time homelessness count, conducted on a single night in January of 2017, recorded an overall statewide increase of 11% in the number of homeless individuals statewide. On that night last January, 1,225 persons were counted as homeless across the state, a reminder that more work must be done if homelessness is to cease in Vermont.

Local Continuums of Care participating in this year's count have participated in prior trainings to support best practices in community involvement.
