# Built for Zero Metrics Overview

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## Monthly Metrics of Populations Experiencing Homelessness

- Inflow – entering system
- Outflow – exiting system

## Purpose: Use Monthly Data to Inform Continuous System Improvement

- Goal is to increase outflow (housing) and reduce inflow (prevention)

# Metrics Breakdown

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## Inflow – entering the CE system

- Newly Identified
- Returning to the CE System from Housing
- Returning from Inactive Status

## Outflow – exiting the CE system

- Permanent Housing Placements
- Inactive
  - Including all temporary exits (homeless situation or temporary housing/institutional setting)

# Definitions

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## Single Adults

- Over age 24 with no children in household
- Includes chronically homeless individuals and veterans
- Excludes youth (18-24) and families with children
- All individuals are included in count

## Families

- Households with at least one adult and one child
- Count is by household not individual

## Youth

- Head of household is age 24 or under

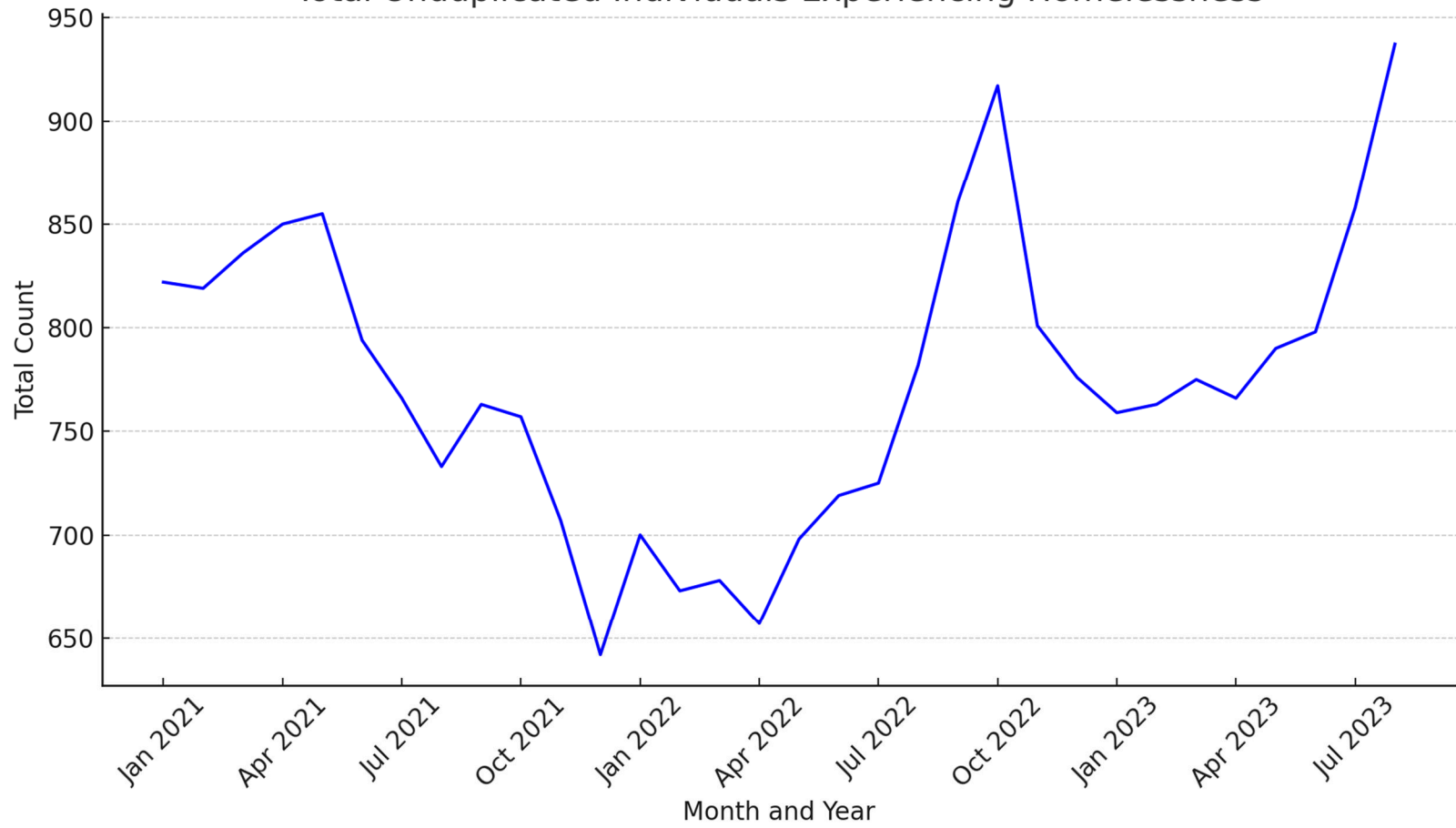

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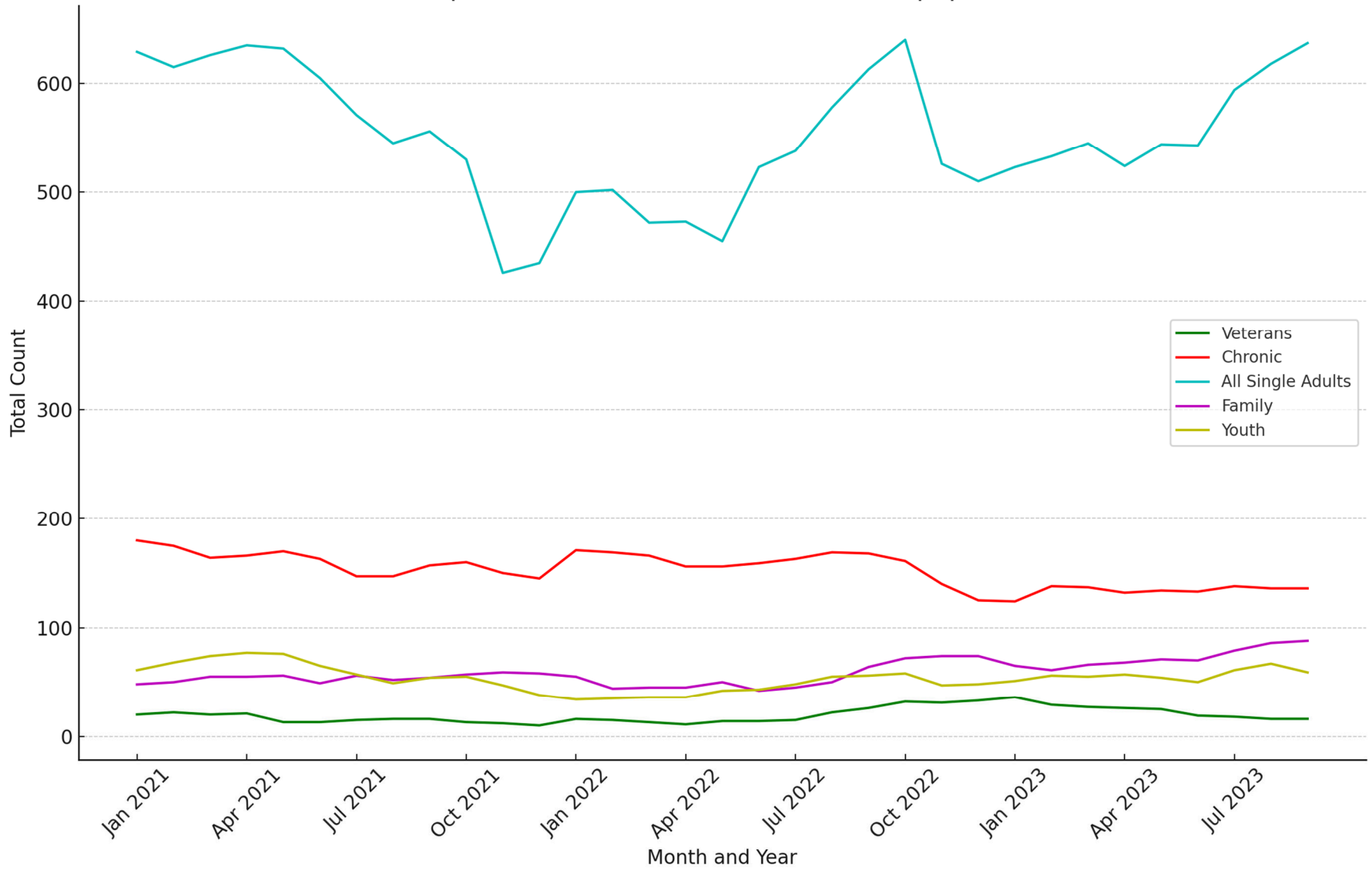
JANUARY 2021 – SEPTEMBER 2023

Comparison of Total Counts for Each Subpopulation

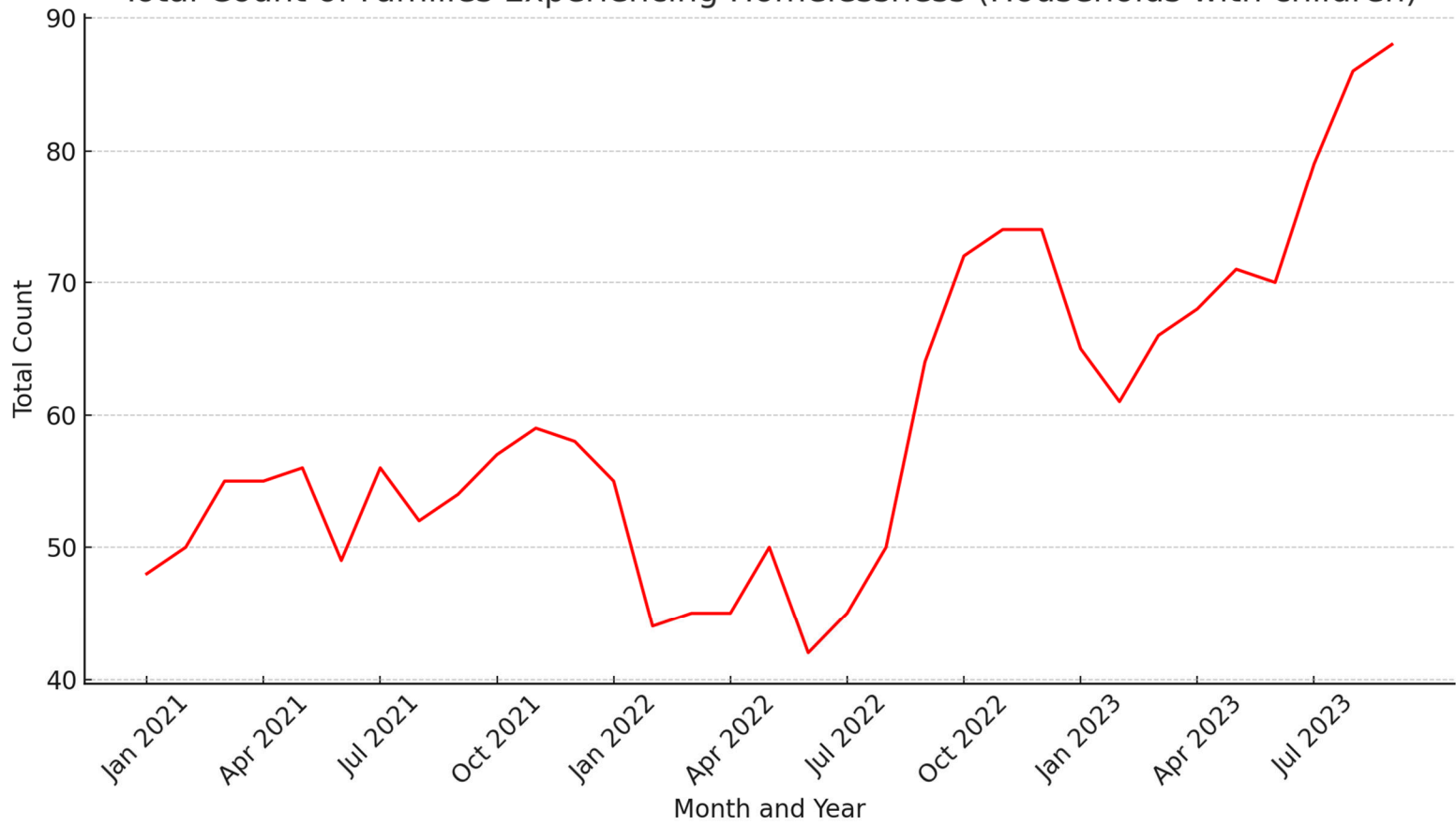




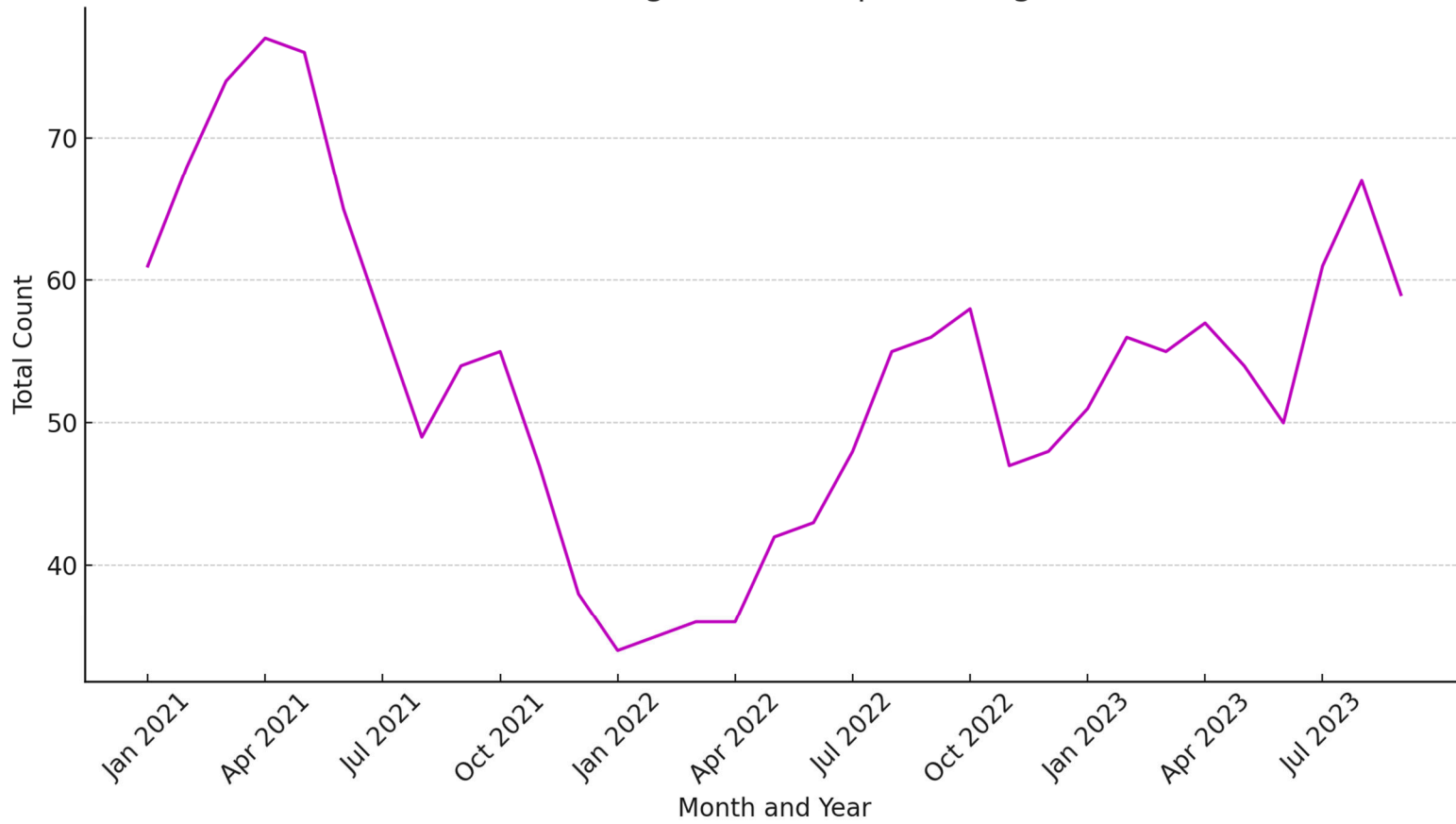
Total Count of Chronic Individuals Experiencing Homelessness



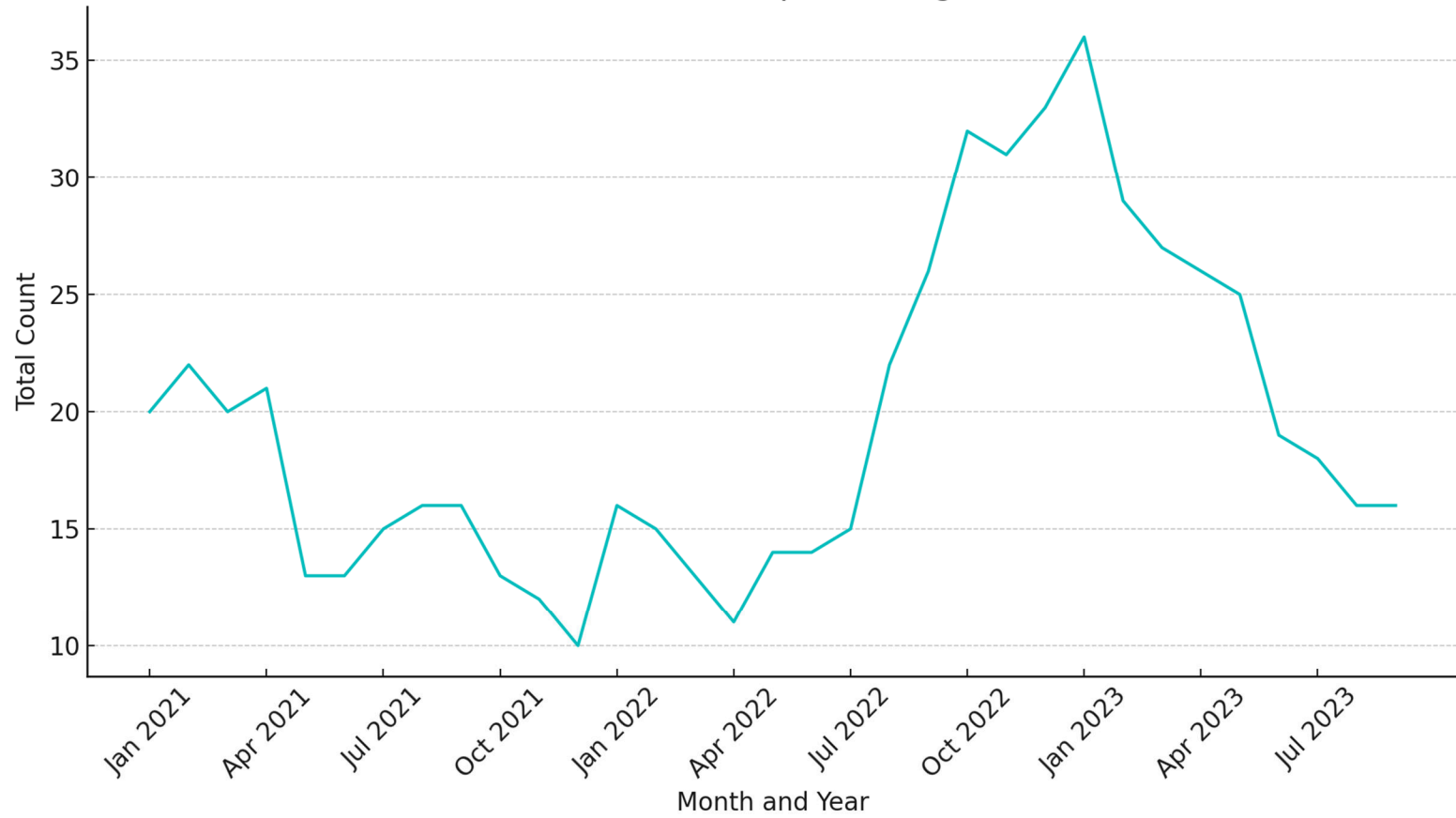
Total Count of Families Experiencing Homelessness (Households with children)

# Key findings

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Chronic Homelessness has been reduced by 25% since Jan 2021

Family Homelessness has increased by over 80% since Jan 2021

Other populations have experienced variation but have returned approximately to Jan 2021 counts

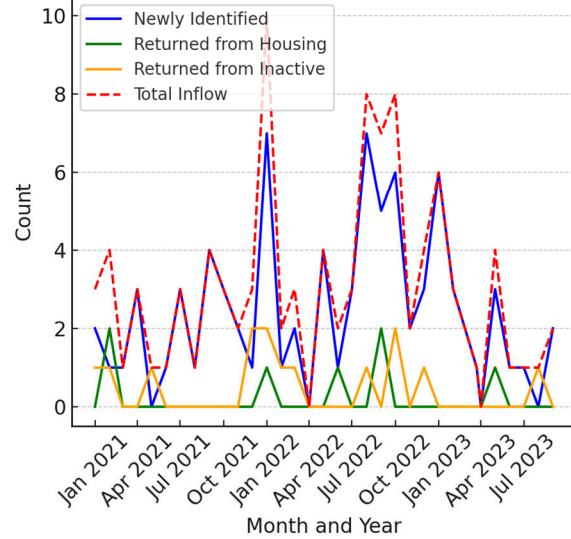

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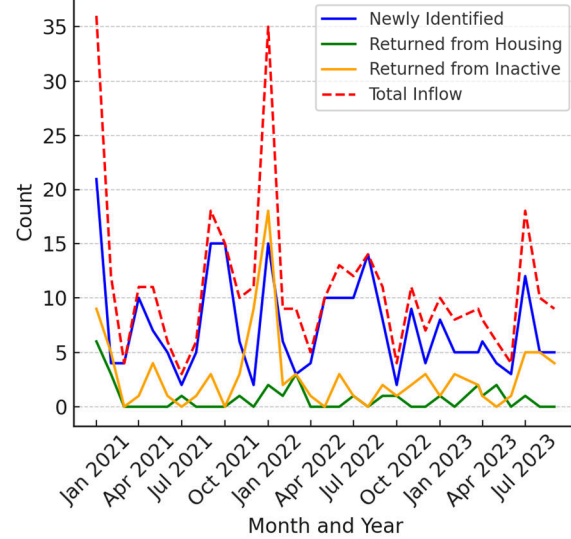

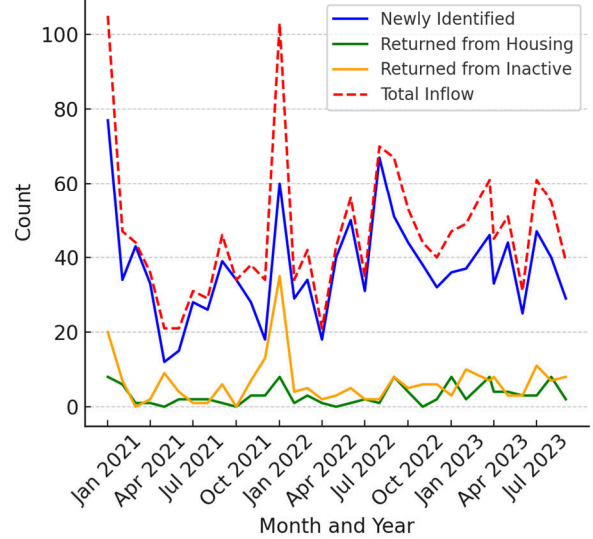

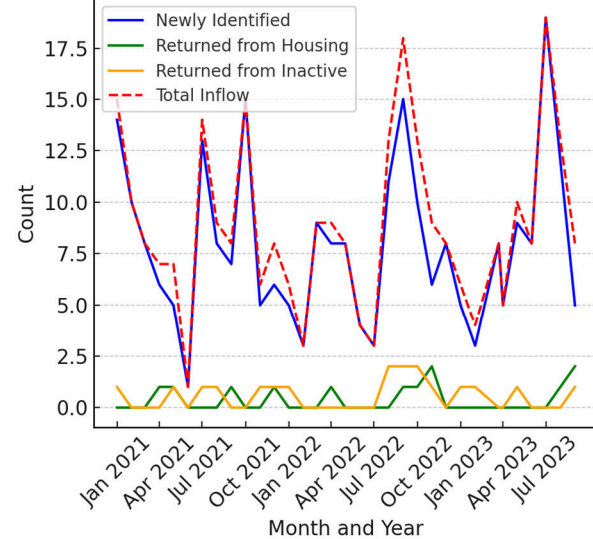

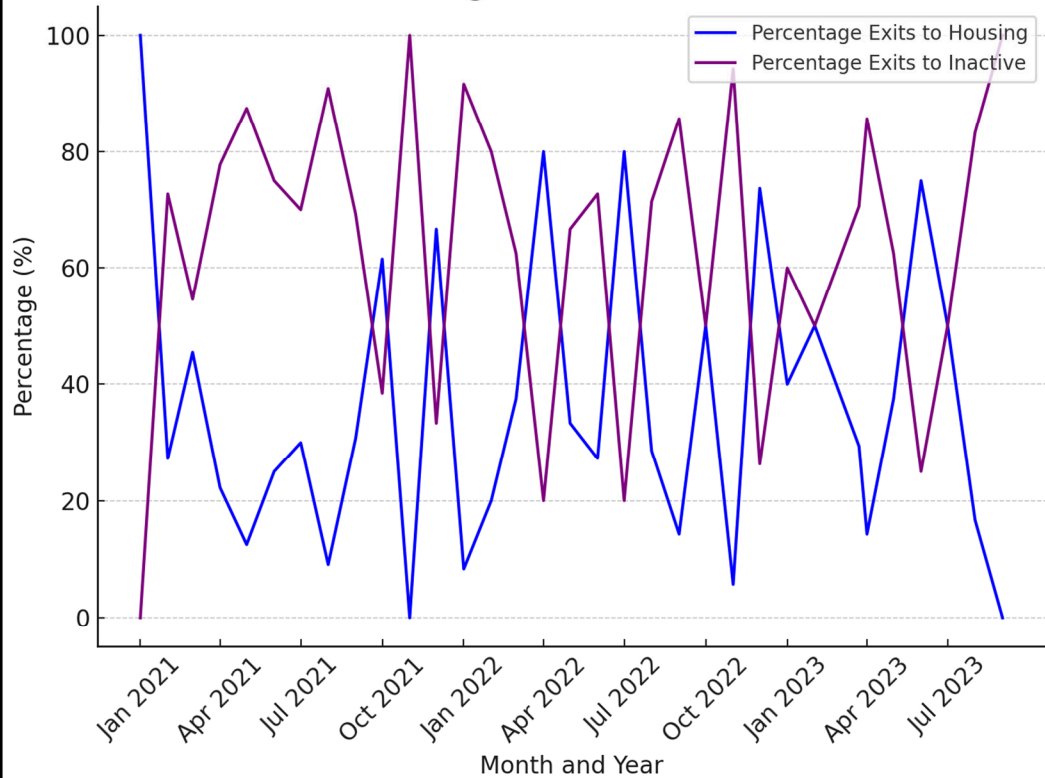

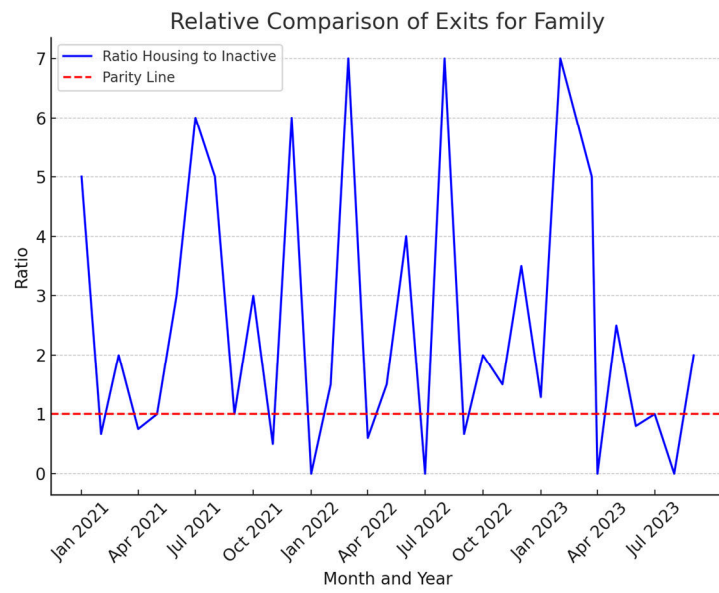
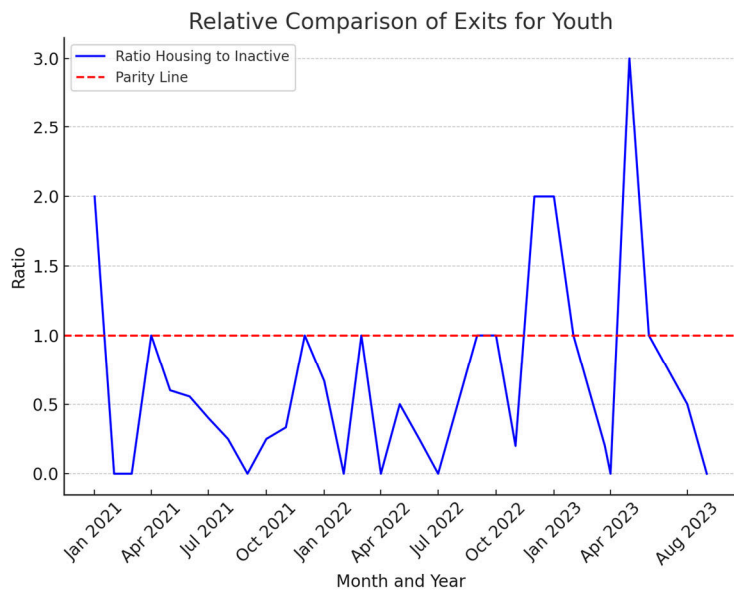

# Key findings

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More families are exiting to housing than to inactive status

Chronically homeless individuals are more likely to exit to inactive than to housing

- Although some months show high rates of exit to housing (high peaks)

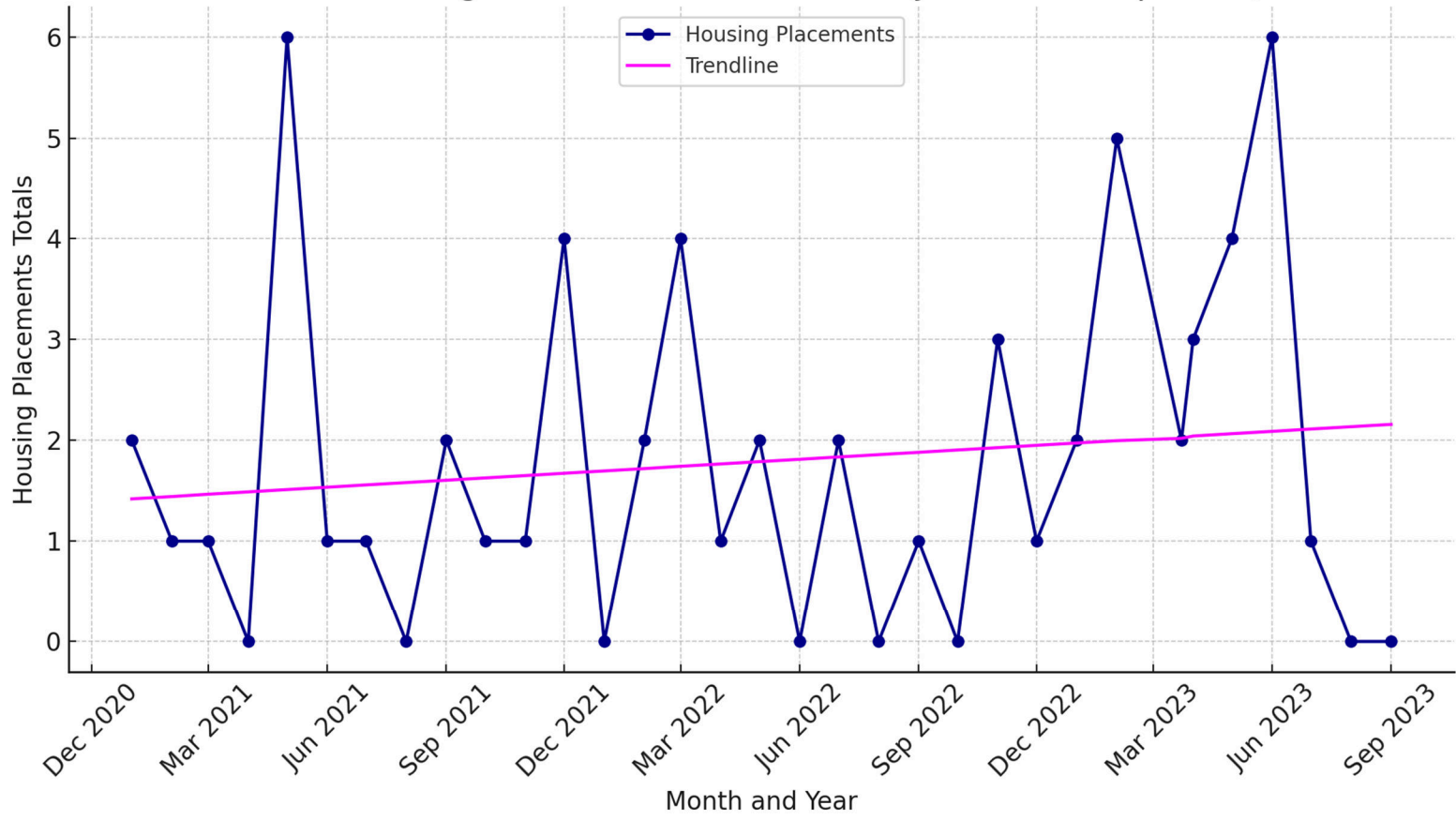

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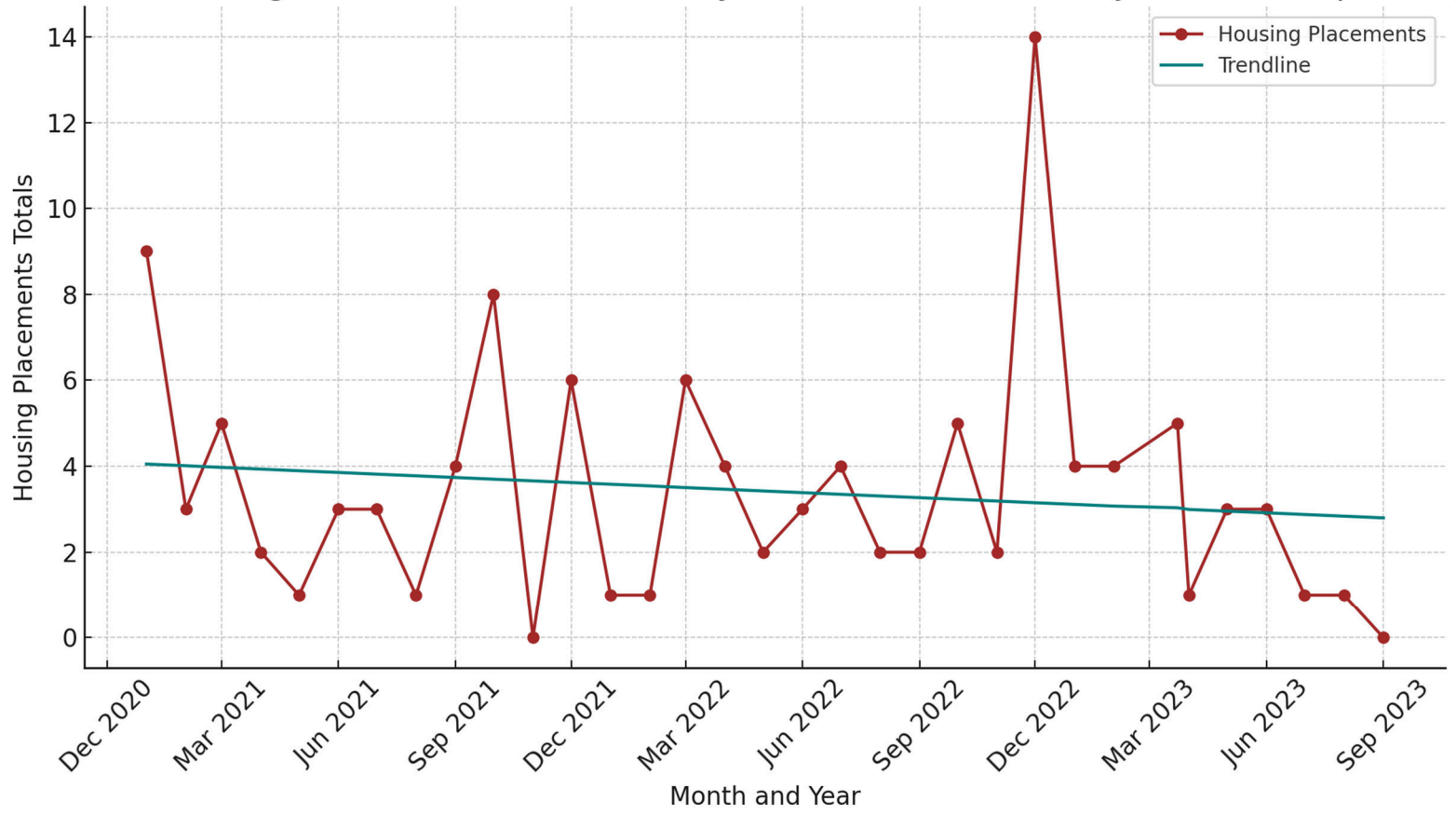
PERMANENT HOUSING EXITS BY SUBPOPULATION



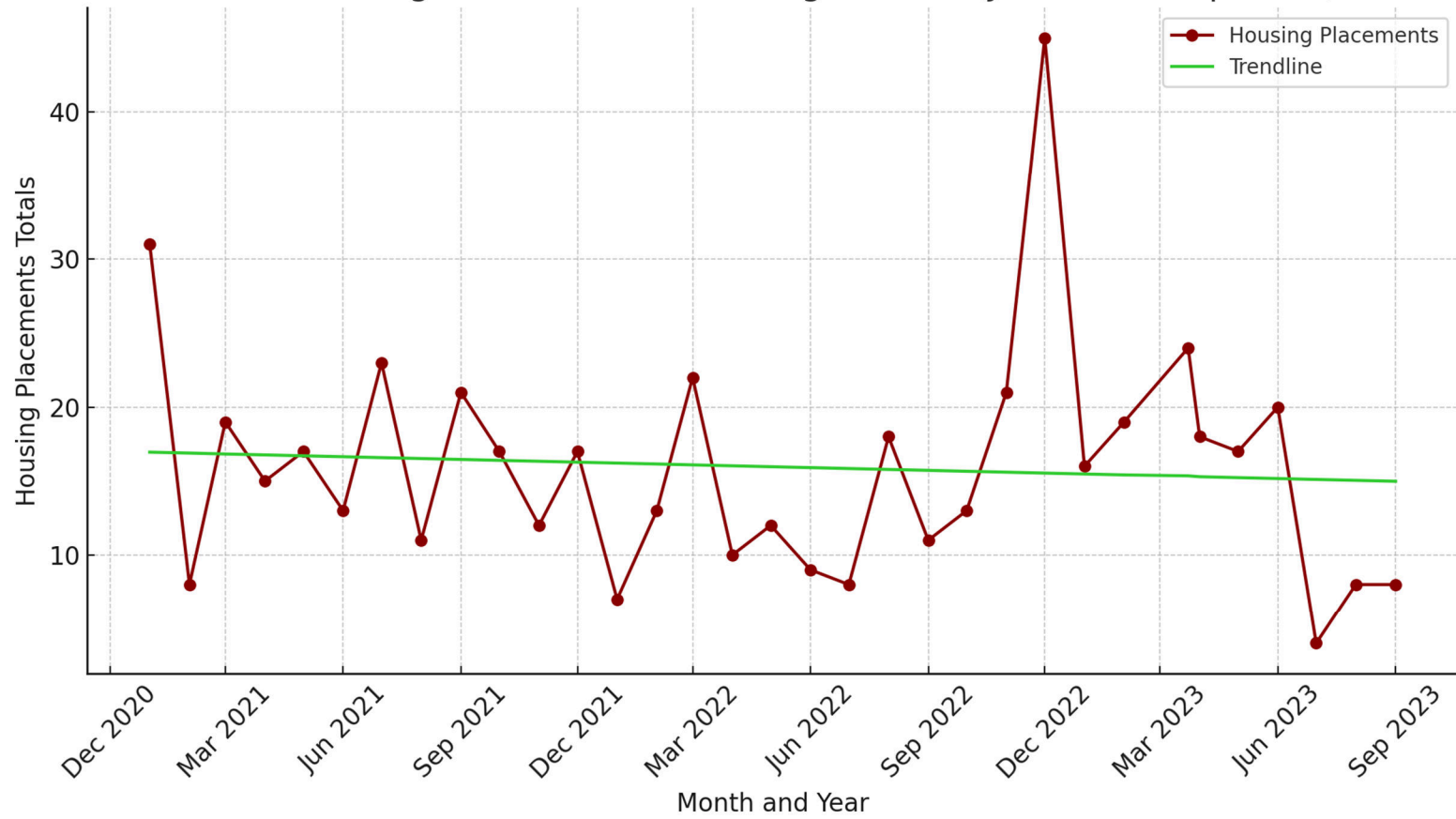
Total Housing Placements for Veterans (Jan 2021 - Sep 2023)



Total Housing Placements for Chronically Homeless Individuals (Jan 2021 - Sep 2023)

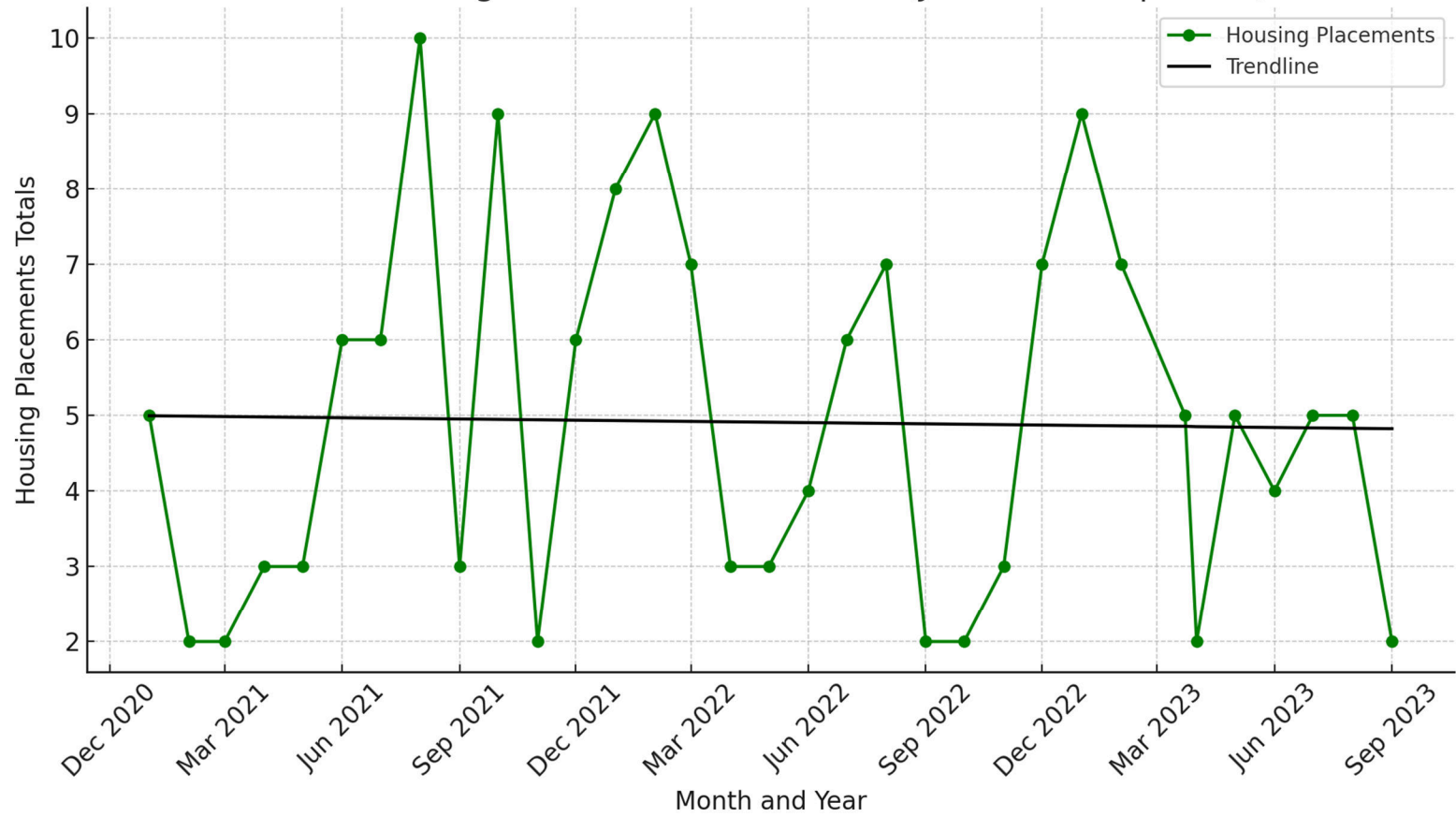

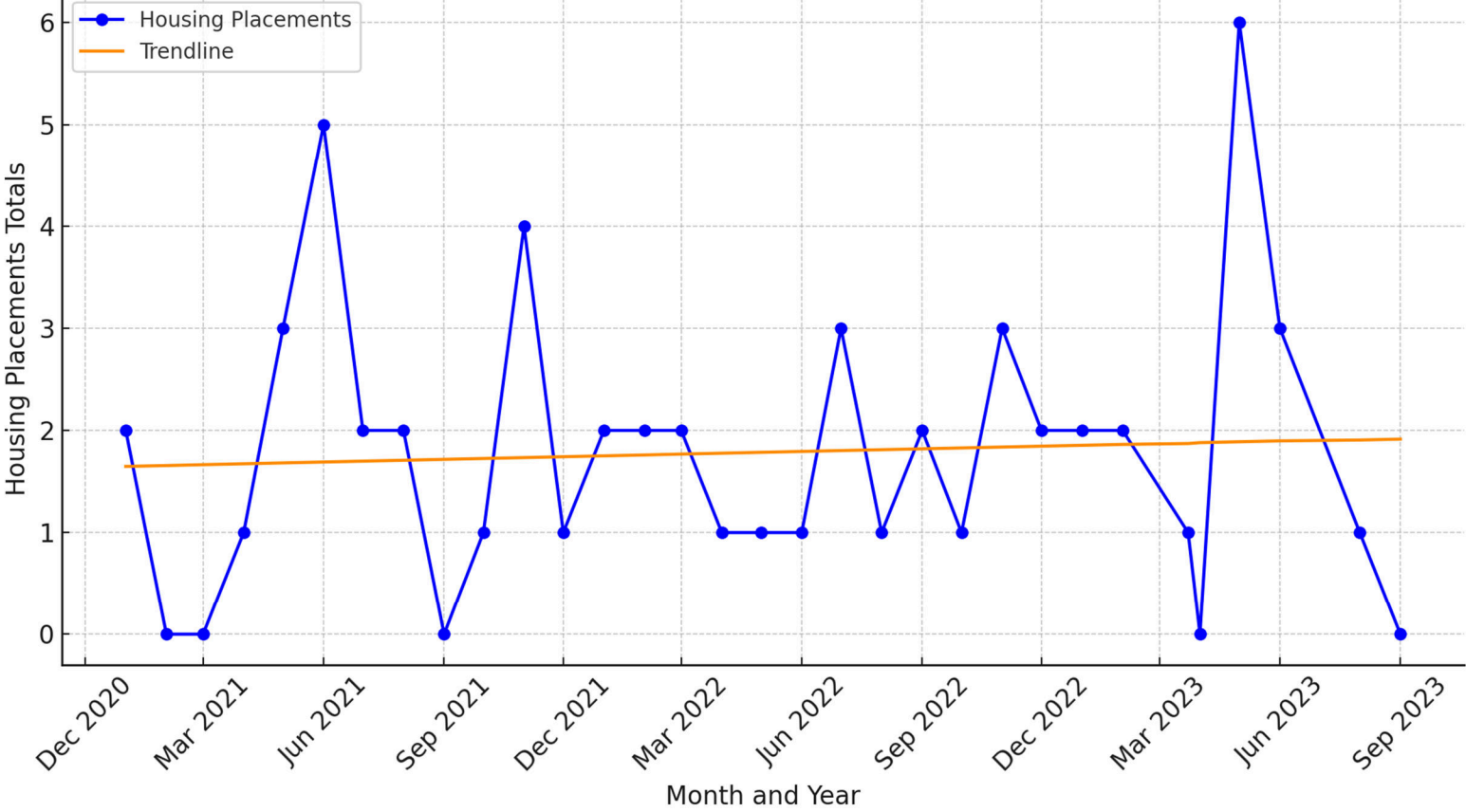




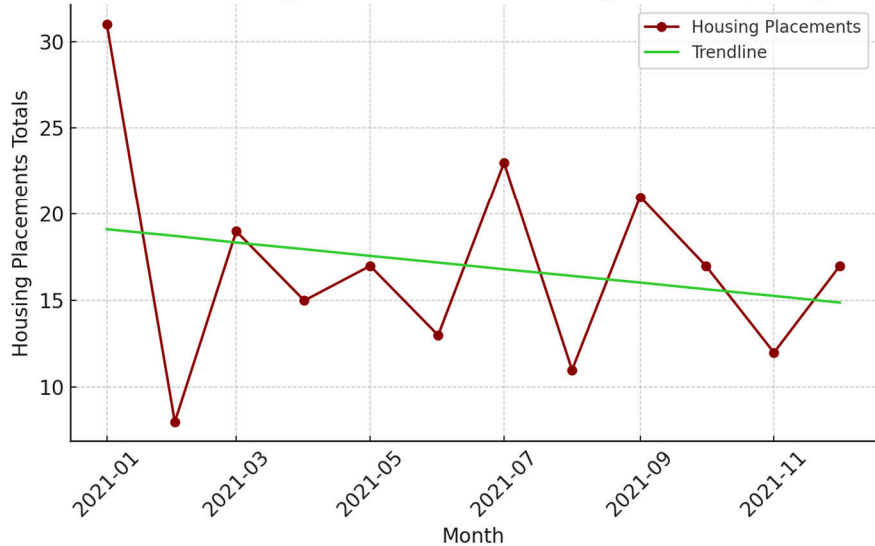

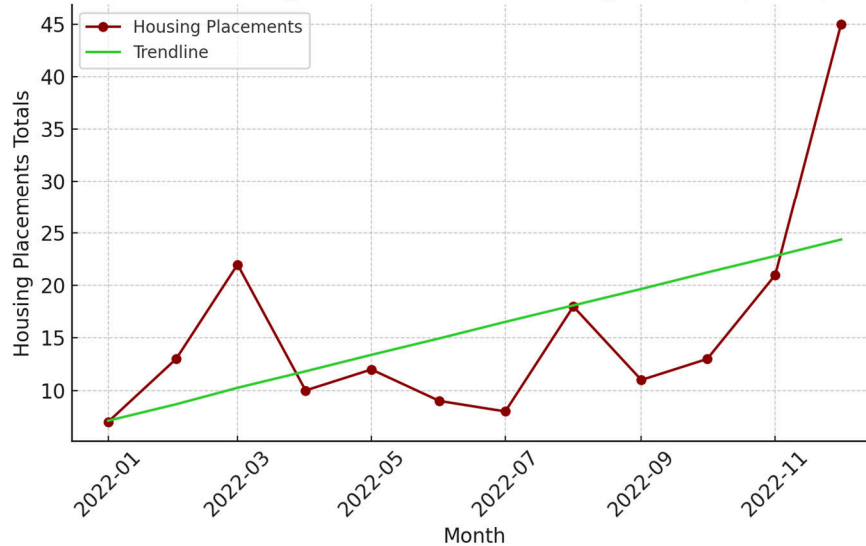

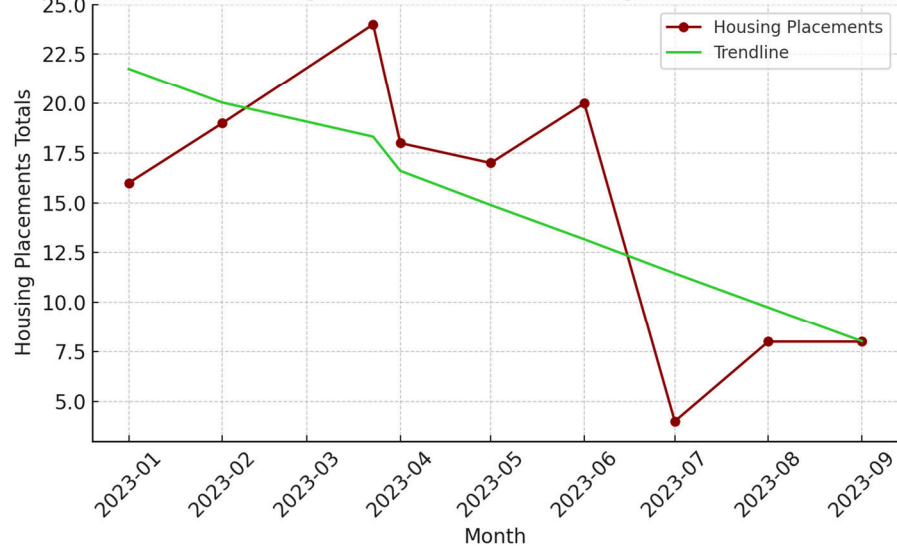

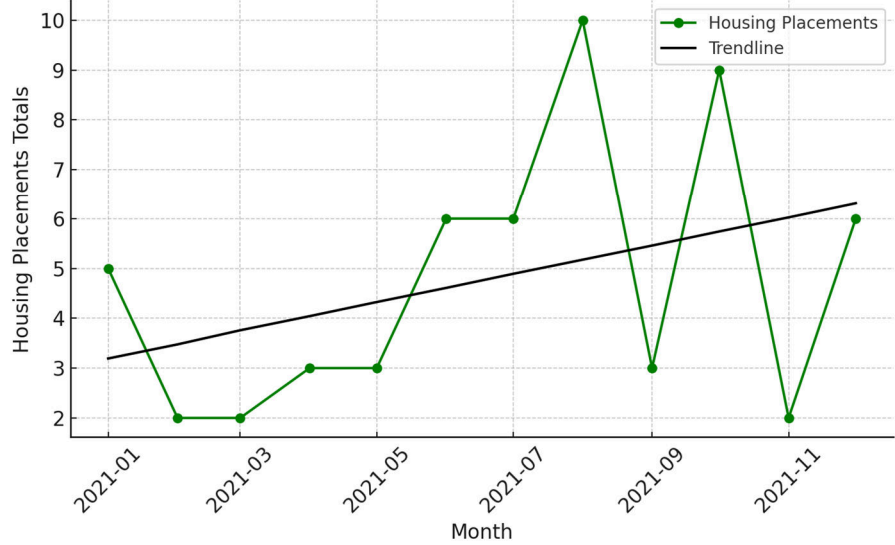

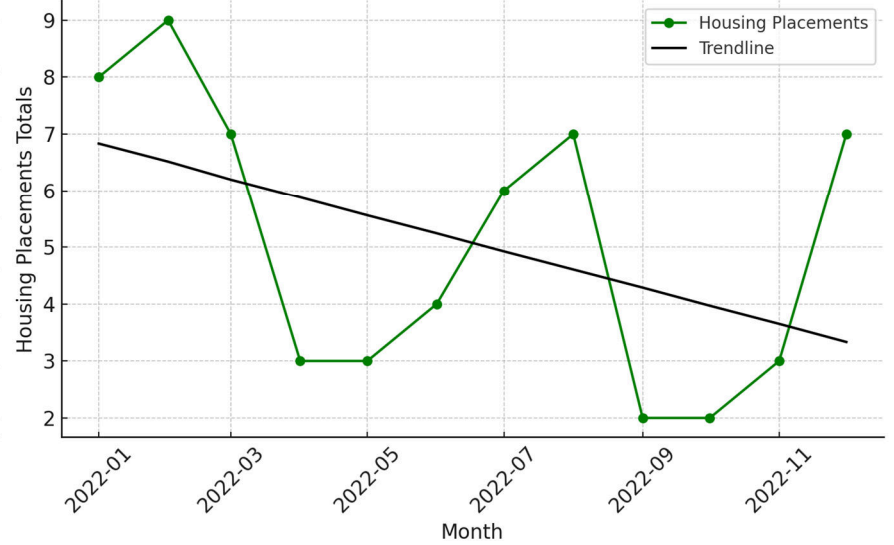

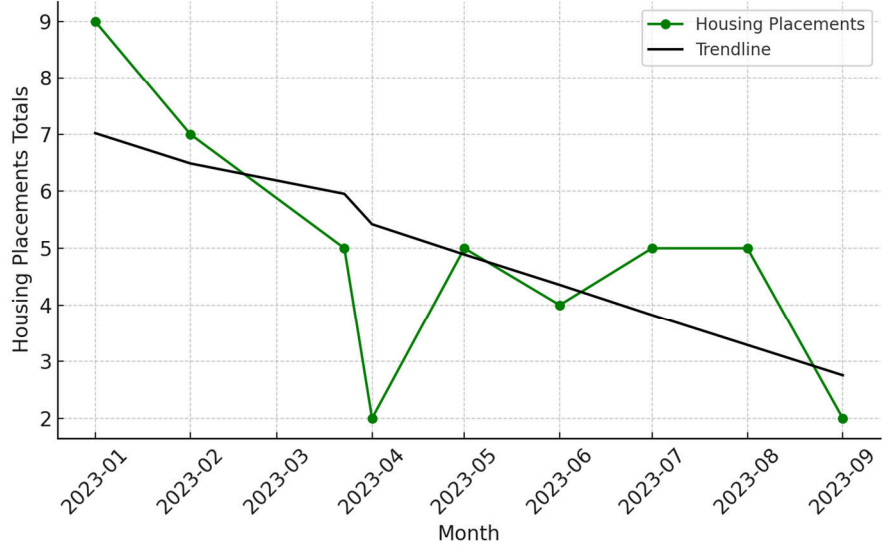

All populations have seen decreasing trendlines in housing placements in 2023

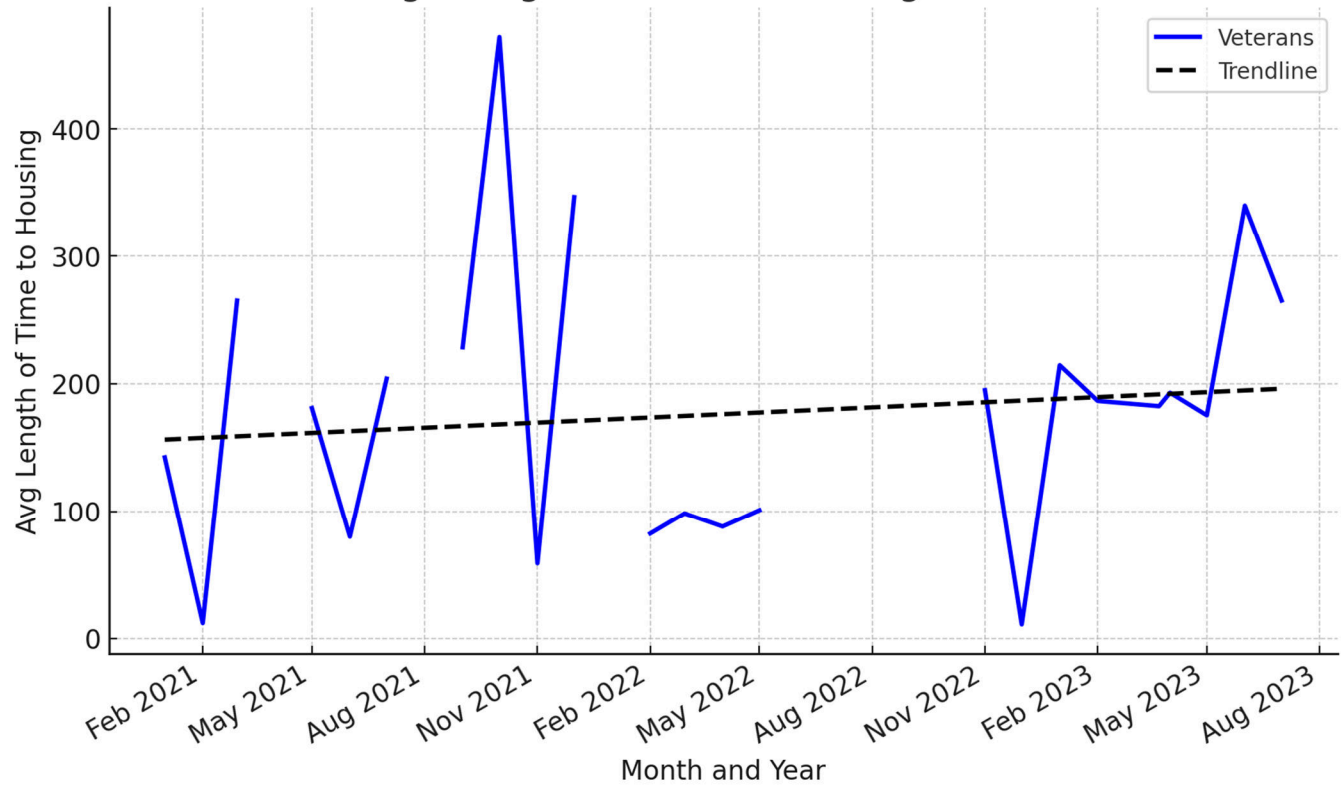

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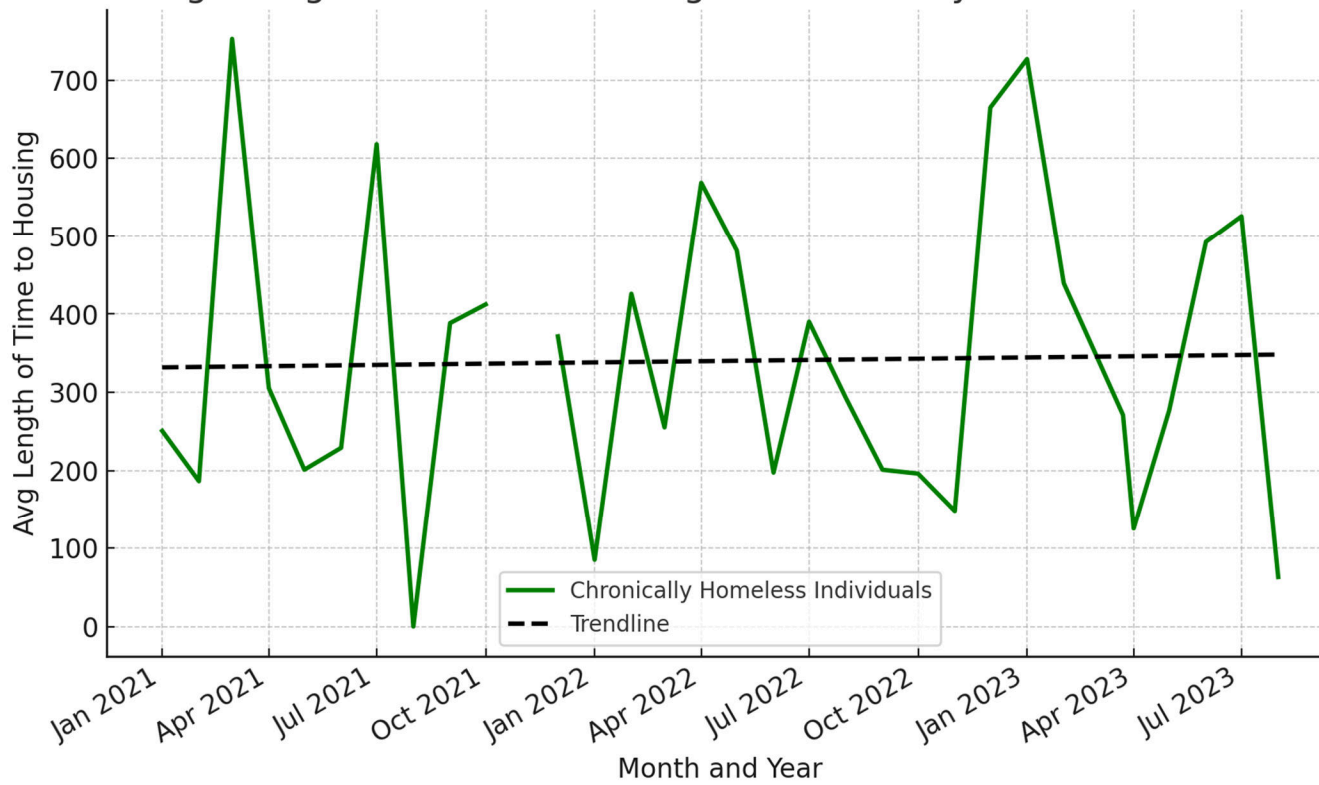
FOR HOUSEHOLDS AND INDIVIDUALS WHO WERE HOUSED IN A GIVEN MONTH



### Average Length of Time to Housing for Veterans

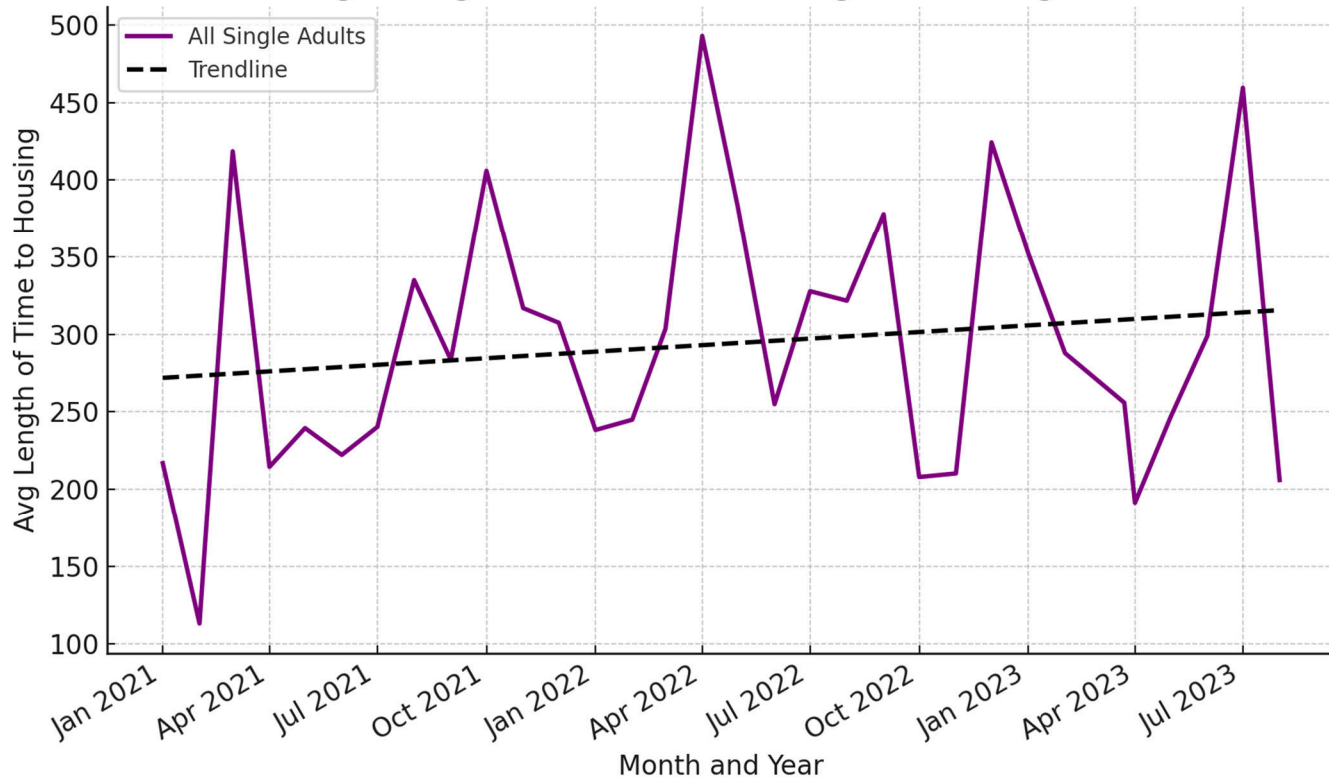


### Average Length of Time to Housing for Chronically Homeless Individuals

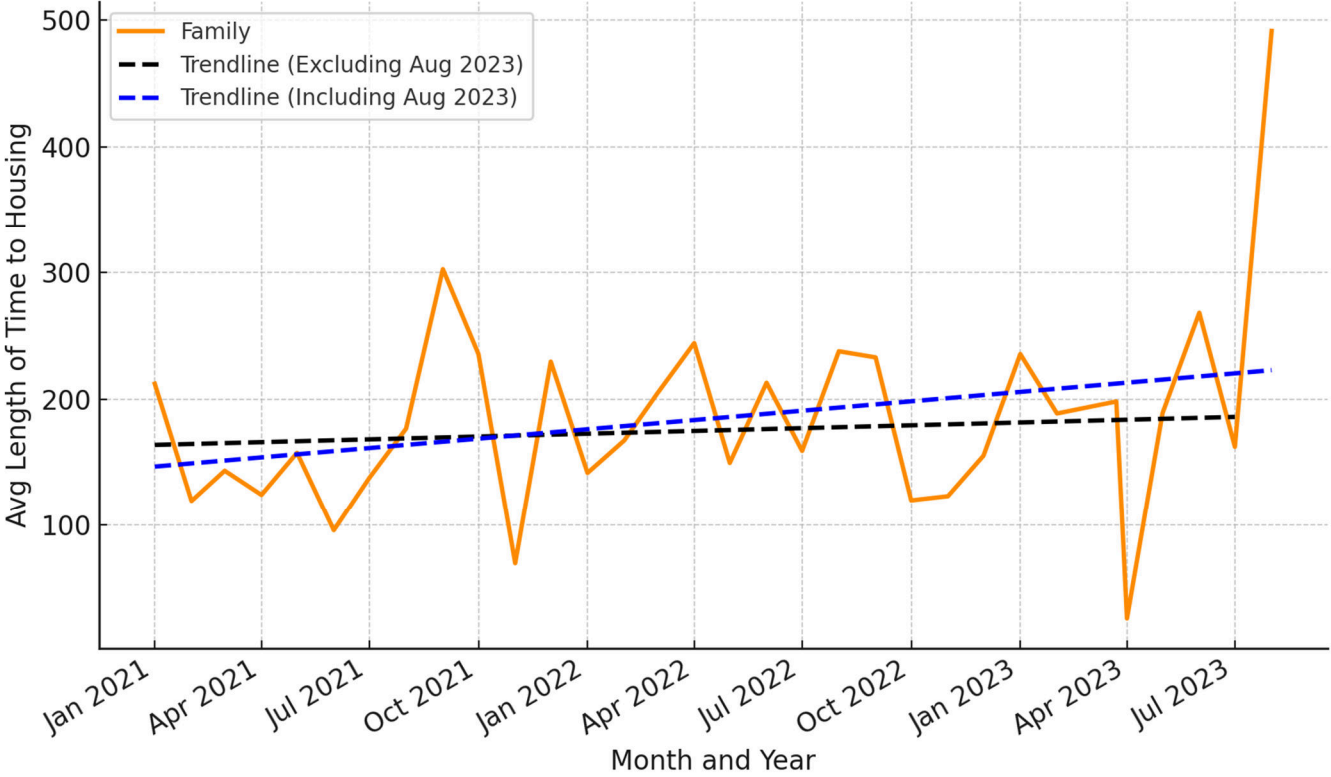




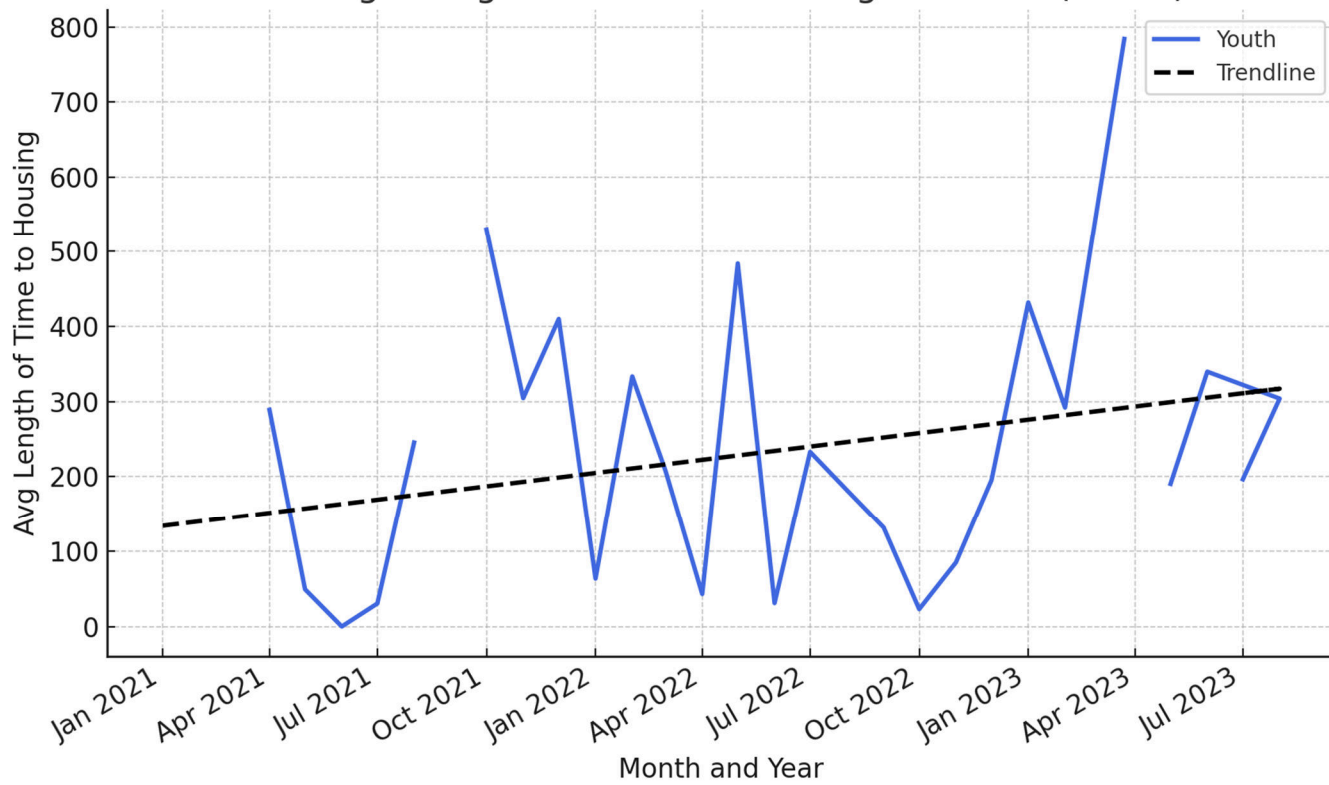
### Average Length of Time to Housing for All Single Adults

# Key findings

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The average length of time to housing is increasing for all populations except single adults from January 2021 to August 2023

Most populations saw a decrease in length of time from 2021 to 2022 and a rise from 2022 to 2023

# Suggestions

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Implement processes to collect more granular data on inflow and outflow

- Where are people entering the system from and where are they exiting to?

Review households returning to systems on a monthly or quarterly basis and assess the reasons for their return

- Are there specific types of subsidy/housing that are associated with increased returns?
- Are there needs that are not being met? Are more supportive services needed?

Analyze trends by demographics and other characteristics – race, gender, age, disability status, etc.

- Are system-level trends and dynamics affecting demographic groups differently?
